

Glassboro Man Pleads Guilty to Unlawful Handgun Possession in Atlantic City

MAYS LANDING, NJ – On Friday, October 25, 2024, Forrest Graves, 36, from Glassboro, NJ, pleaded guilty to second-degree Unlawful Possession of a Handgun before the Honorable Pamela D'Arcy, J.S.C. Graves' guilty plea calls for a five-year New Jersey State Prison sentence with a 42-month period of parole ineligibility and forfeiture of the weapon.

On August 17, 2023, at approximately 12:10 a.m., officers from the Atlantic City Police Department were dispatched to 129 S. Virginia Avenue in reference to a male refusing to leave the property and taking off his clothing. Upon arrival, officers came into contact with a staff member who pointed out the male, later identified as Forrest Graves, who was laying on the ground naked. While attempting to speak to Graves, he did not respond back to officers. Graves continued to lay on the ground and refused to wake up. Police requested an ambulance to treat Graves. A black Ruger LCP .380 handgun with hollow point ammunition was located in Graves' black shorts in a pocket. Graves was placed into custody and brought to the hospital prior to processing.

Graves is scheduled to be sentenced on January 16, 2025. He remains detained pending sentencing.
