Mullica Twp. Man Indicted for 1991 Sexual Assault and Murder of Mullica Twp. Woman

MAYS LANDING, NJ – On Wednesday, August 6, 2025, Eddie Sykes, 55, of Mullica Twp., NJ, was indicted by an Atlantic County Grand Jury for the first-degree murder, first-degree felony murder, and first-degree aggravated sexual assault of Evelyn Caez, 23 at the time of her death, also of Mullica Twp.

On October 12, 1991, at approximately 7:30 a.m., the Mullica Township Police Department responded to 1 W. Lakeview Drive in Mullica Twp. Police located Baez, who was deceased, in the kitchen of her residence. An autopsy revealed that the victim died as a result of stab wounds, and the manner of death was a homicide. There was additional evidence of sexual assault.

This investigation has remained active over the years and reevaluated for additional forensic testing. In September of 2023, the N.J.S.P. Office of Forensic Sciences reexamined forensic evidence from the crime scene resubmitted by the Atlantic County Prosecutor's Office. In January 2024, this additional forensic examination resulted in the detection of DNA on the victim's underwear. The DNA evidence on the underwear was identified as belonging to Eddie Sykes.

Sykes was initially interviewed in 1991 and denied knowing the victim. An eyewitness placed him riding his bicycle in circles outside of the victim's house the night of the murder.

Sykes is currently serving a prison sentence of 30 years to life in New Jersey State Prison for a 1992 homicide that occurred in Burlington County, NJ. If found guilty on the new charges, the defendant faces a life sentence without the possibility of parole.

This incident was investigated by the Atlantic County Prosecutor's Office's Major Crimes Unit. The New Jersey State Police Office of Forensic Sciences, Federal Bureau of Investigation, and Mullica Township Police Department have also assisted in this investigation.

These charges are merely an accusation and not proof of guilt. In all criminal cases, a charged defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
